WHAT IS THE GOLDEN RAVEN EXPERIENCE?

The Golden Raven initiative is a marketing program developed to promote the excellent cultural opportunities that exist in the north central region. WHAT DO THE GOLDEN RAVEN FACILITIES HAVE IN COMMON?

All Golden Raven facilities are funded by the Regional District of Fraser-Fort George and are working collaboratively to promote each other while also working to improve their operations. They are the keepers of the region's rich culture and history.

WHY A GOLDEN RAVEN?

The Golden Raven symbolizes many desirable qualities that are reflected in the cultural and historic attractions across the region. The raven itself is a hardy creature, adaptable to circumstances, and the colour gold has been used to link the gold-rush days while also conveying the high level of experience that is being offered. The raven is very social and deeply rooted in the Aboriginal community. It is also recognized as a valued animal that is common throughout the region.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO VISIT A GOLDEN RAVEN ATTRACTION?

The Golden Raven Experience means visitors receive an authentic and enthusiastic presentation of the region's culture and history.
