

BYLAW NO. 1797

Regional District of Fraser-Fort George Bylaw No. 1797 establishes:

- Tipping fee rates
- Definition of terms
- Site regulations, and
- Permit and approval requirements for Controlled and Special Wastes

CENTRALIZED COMPOSTING

Large quantities of source separated yard and garden waste can be dropped off at the Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill at no charge. The material will be added to the centralized composting process, thereby diverting a valuable resource from being landfilled. Finished compost is sold at the Foothills Landfill facility.

RECYCLING BIN

The Regional District and its contractor, Metro Materials Recovery Inc., have established recycling drop depots throughout the Regional District. Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill provides recycling bins for corrugated cardboard and multi-material recycling. Multi-material recycling bins are divided into three compartments:

Newspaper

No newspaper in bundles or bags. Please place loose in the bins.

Metal Food Containers and Plastic Milk Jugs

Steel, tin or aluminum cans that originally contained food or beverages. Rinse cans, remove labels, put lids inside of cans and flatten. Rinse jugs and remove lids; flatten jugs prior to putting them in the bin.

Mixed Paper

*Cardboard, catalogues, glossy flyers, cereal boxes, office paper, kraft grocery bags, envelopes, magazines and cardboard egg cartons are all acceptable. **NO paper that has any plastic, foil or wax attached to it is accepted (e.g., milk cartons, drink cartons). No paper contaminated with food.***

SWAP SHED

The Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill has a waste exchange area where reusable items can be either dropped off or picked up free of charge. Accepted items include clothing, books, toys, sporting goods and furniture. For cleaning and maintenance, the Swap Shed is **closed every Thursday**.

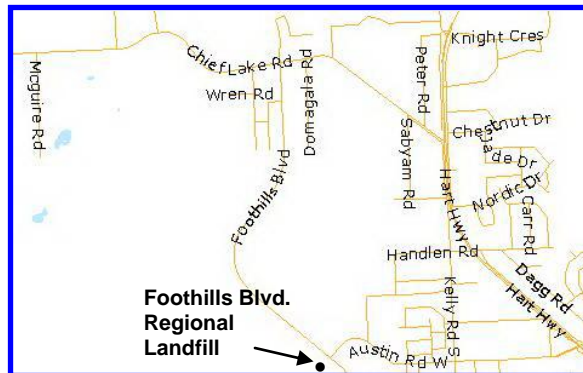
SALVAGING

Salvaging of materials from dumping areas, transfer bins, recycling bins or the Marshalling Area is not permitted.

Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill

SITE OPERATION

The Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill is operated by the Regional District of Fraser-Fort George. As the largest landfill in the Regional District, the Foothills Landfill plays a central role in the Regional Solid Waste Management Program.

LANDFILL SERVICES

The site provides opportunities for recycling, centralized composting of yard and garden trimmings, “Swap Shed” exchange area, residential waste disposal by way of an on-site transfer station and commercial waste disposal.

TIPPING FEES AND SITE REGULATIONS

A tipping fee is a charge levied for disposal of waste and is based on weight and type of material. Tipping fees apply to “controlled waste”, refuse and demolition, land clearing and construction waste (DLC). Residents may still drop off small loads (defined under Fees) of refuse and DLC without charge. This is the first step toward a user-pay system where generators of waste are charged according to the amount they produce.

Fees

The fee to dispose of refuse and demolition, land clearing and construction waste in other than small loads* is \$55 per tonne or a \$5 minimum charge per load. Load weights are measured on scales provided at the landfill.

*A small load is defined as solid waste that arrives at the disposal site in:

- A vehicle having a maximum GVW (gross vehicle weight) rating of 3,400 kg; or
- A vehicle having a maximum GVW rating of 3,400 kg towing a trailer, where the weight of the load on the vehicle and trailer combination is 500 kg or less.

CONTROLLED WASTE

Controlled wastes are materials that require special handling and disposal techniques to avoid creating health hazards, nuisances or environmental pollution. Controlled wastes require pre-approval and a Regional District permit prior to delivery. Check with landfill staff concerning permits and delivery times.

Permits for Disposal of Controlled Waste

A permit issued by the Regional District is required to deposit a controlled waste at the Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill. Permit application forms are available from the Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill during regular operating hours. If the waste is classified as Hazardous Waste (asbestos), hydrocarbon impacted soil, some sludges, or industrial burner ash the BC Ministry of Environment (MoE) must approve delivery and disposal (250-565-6135).

PROHIBITED MATERIALS

The following materials are not accepted for disposal at the Landfill. For disposal options, please consult with the attendant.

Liquids
Reactive Waste
Hazardous Waste
Fuels
Fencing wire/wire
Industrial Chemical Waste
Slurry
Radioactive Waste
Refuse (on fire or smoldering)

Steel/Plastic Drums (if not cut/crushed/perforated)
Special Waste (except as a permitted Controlled Waste)
Explosives
Ignitable Waste
Lubricants
Tires on Rims
Paints/Solvents

Now available for disposal at the Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill: *used oil, oil filters, antifreeze and lead acid batteries disposal.*

PAYMENT

Payment may be made by cash, cheque, MasterCard, VISA or debit card. Commercial customers may apply to the Regional District for credit accounts. Application forms may be obtained from the Foothills Boulevard Regional Landfill during operating hours or from Financial Services at 155 George Street, Prince George, BC between 8:45 am and noon and 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm, Monday to Friday (excluding statutory holidays).
