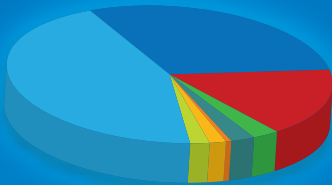

2016 Year End INCOME STATEMENT

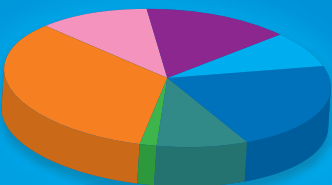

NEW Public Alerting System

The Regional District's public alerting system is now live. Electoral Area residents can stay up to date on emergency events in the electoral areas of the region by signing up via the Regional District website. The system will enable you to be connected and informed with critical information quickly during an emergency situation such as a forest fire. You can sign up here: <https://rdffg.connectrocket.com>

Notifications about emergency events within the Regional District electoral areas are delivered by text message and text to land line message to those who have signed up. The notifications are intended to inform residents and visitors alike about emergency incidents that could impact them. Working together, we can take proactive steps to build a safer and more resilient community.

If you don't have access to a computer and don't have a cell phone, call the Regional District at 250-960-4450 to be registered to receive notifications via text to land line messaging.

2017 Community **ORGANIZATION WORKSHOP**

The annual Community Organization Workshop was held at the Regional District office in May. Representatives from fifteen community associations within the electoral areas of the Regional District were in attendance to watch presentations about Community Emergency Planning, recycling and funding opportunities with Northern Development Initiative Trust.

Representatives from Volunteer Prince George were also in attendance to facilitate presentations on recruiting and maintaining volunteers and give an update on the new *Societies Act* and the potential for future workshops to be held within the electoral areas. The annual community organization workshop is an opportunity for community organizations within the Regional District to network and to gain education and information to support their activities. ▲

ABOUT US

The Regional District of Fraser-Fort George is home to over 93,000 residents and covers 52,000 square kilometers in central British Columbia – an area almost as large as the province of Nova Scotia. It extends from the Pine Pass in the north to Hixon in the south, and from Bednesti Lake west of Prince George to the Alberta border. As a local government, the Regional District is accountable

to the residents of the region. Services provided include fire protection, 9-1-1 emergency services, solid waste management, community sewer and water systems, land use planning, cultural and recreational services and parks. Total operating expenditures in 2016 were \$36.7 million.

The governing board of the Regional District has fourteen directors: four appointed by the City of

Prince George from its council, one appointed by each of the councils of the District of Mackenzie, Village of McBride and Village of Valemount, and seven directors elected from within each of the seven electoral areas covering the unincorporated portions of the Regional District. ▲
